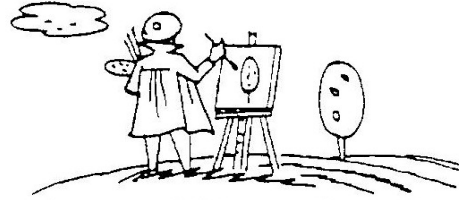

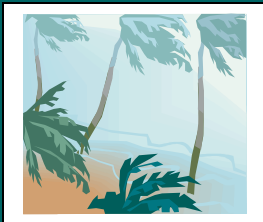

SEPTEMBER SPEAKER

At the September meeting, we will have a presentation by Slash Coleman about storytelling through art.

Slash is a professional storyteller who is best known for his award winning PBS special and Off-Broadway storytelling concert, "The Neon Man and Me." So far, his productions have helped raise over \$90,000 for non-profits around the country. Descended from a grandfather who was a dancer at the Moulin Rouge, a grandmother who was a painter, and a father who is a prolific sculptor, Slash draws much of his material from being raised by an offbeat, creative family. As a lively interview guest, he's appeared multiple times on NPR, and has been featured in "American Theater Magazine", The "Washington Post", and "Backstage Magazine". Coleman, who has also

made his living as a visual artist and jazz pianist, currently lives in Richmond, VA where he continues to develop new stories for stage, film and television projects.

According to Slash, discovering the story that you want to tell through your art can be a lifelong journey. For those who are fortunate enough to discover this nugget, it can be like finding a gem. But how do you find it, maintain it, market and sell your vision once you've found it? Through this inspiring presentation, you'll get a glimpse into what it means to "make it," and how to know when you've reached your destination.

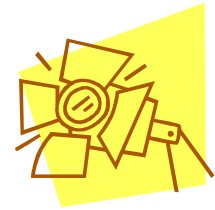
Spotlight on the Board

This month the spotlight shines on our treasurer, **Nancy Foley**, who has been a member of the Art League since 2003.

Nancy tells us she first picked up a paintbrush just eleven years ago at the insistence of her good friend, Marla Coleman, who talked her into taking her first art class with Ann Chenoweth at the Virginia Museum Studio School. Since then, Nancy has studied with many of Richmond's local lights, including Anne Chaddock, Ellie Cox, Christophora Robeers, Sue Stuller and Christopher Wynn.

Nancy paints in watercolor and acrylics, but she says watercolor is her "fav." She says she doesn't really have a particular favorite subject matter. She likes to paint almost anything except portraits; although she does do pet portraits.

Nancy is a Richmond native, who, after receiving a BS from VCU in sociology, started a manufacturing business with her husband. (They built overhead cranes.) She has two sons and a two year old baby granddaughter. When she isn't painting (or baby-



sitting), she enjoys photography and practicing Yoga.

Nancy served the James River Art League as Newsletter Chairman from September, 2005 to May, 2007 and has held the official position of Treasurer since September of 2007.

Her work has been recognized locally. Most recent and impressive accomplishments include being accepted into the Virginia Watercolor Society's 31st annual juried show in May-June of 2010 and winning the JRAL award for "Best In Show" at our own annual juried show at the Atrium in June.
