PEOPLE’S CHOICE AWARDS A BIG HIT!

In JRAL’s first exhibit dedicated solely to People’s Choice Awards, four member artists were voted the People’s Choice in their respective mediums during the June 10th reception at First Unitarian Universalist Church. These awards were voted on by members of JRAL and the exhibit’s visiting public. They were awarded by JRAL President Elizabeth Hood. “This show is fun,” she commented. “Because of the multi-medium vote, people are really engaging with the paintings more than I’ve ever noticed before. It is a special honor,” she added, “to have your work appreciated by your peers.”

Fifty-two JRAL artists are participating in this exhibit, which runs through July 30.

JRAL Presents *Jane Neal Cox Award* to Outstanding Art Student at GWHS

The James River Art League was proud to present the *Jane Neal Cox Award* to Amber Jeter, named this year’s outstanding senior art student at George Wythe High School, at the May 25th school awards ceremony. The award was presented to Amber by JRAL Outreach Committee Chair Connie de Bordenave, accompanied at the ceremony by committee members Terry Atkinson, and Linda Hultgren.

This award has been named in honor of the late Jane Cox, an outstanding member of the Art League who spearheaded our outreach program to support the art curriculum at George Wythe. This year’s \$150 cash award was funded by the JRAL Treasury and anonymous donations by League members.

Jane Cox began her career as a Spanish teacher at GWHS when it first opened in 1960. She later taught at Maggie Walker, and then in the Henrico County schools until she retired. Jane served JRAL in various leadership positions, including as its President; but her role as the Chair of the Community Outreach Committee was the one that was nearest and dearest to her heart. Her commitment to Richmond Public Schools, especially the art program at George Wythe, was extraordinary.

This summer, JRAL is also honoring Jane’s memory with an exhibit of her work on one of the walls in our JRAL Gallery at Crossroads. A collection of Jane’s paintings will be displayed by special arrangement with her family; the gallery fee for the wall space will be funded by donations from many of Jane’s JRAL friends. The exhibit will run June 28-August 29.

JRAL’s continued support of Wythe’s art program includes the purchase of needed art supplies for the students. All three art instructors have expressed much gratitude for the supplies that we have donated throughout the year, both from individual members and from JRAL as a whole. Connie de Bordenave shares that gratitude: “Many thanks to you all for your generosity. Providing supplies for art creates pathways for growth, encouragement, and expression for the 450 students that are currently enrolled in the Art program at George Wythe.”

The Real Deal




